Bond survey seeking resident ideas closes Dec. 5

PROSPER (November 29, 2010) Town planners are sifting through the myriad of suggestions and ideas related to the planned bond program that have come in via the various methods that Town residents have used to submit them, according to Town Manager Mike Land.

“The methods have included everything from telephone conversations, e-mail messages, formal and informal meetings, conversations at community events, letters, notes and, of course, the survey. We’re excited about the possibilities before us, and we need to make sure we have everyone’s input,” said Land.

To ensure full participation, the Town has made the survey accessible via the Town web site and in paper form available at various locations. However, the deadline for returning the surveys is fast approaching.

“In order to consolidate all of the comments and report back to the Town Council on what the citizens are considering, we must set a close-off date for the surveys,” he added.

That close-off date is Sunday, December 5. After then, Town staff and the Bond Committee will review all of the input, categorize the suggestions, prioritize the responses, develop a report and create a recommendation list to be presented to the Council.

The Council will review the input and make the final determination as to whether or not to call for a bond election, and if so, what projects would be funded, should the bond election pass favorably.

“It’s still a long way off, but public input is the first step, and that’s what the survey will report,” concluded Land. The survey can be found on the home page of www.prospertx.gov.
